British immigrant, philanthropist and entrepreneur,
Alfred Felton moved into the Hotel Esplanade in 1891.

He filled his rooms with paintings, sculptures, books, maps,
magazines and hand-made, now antique, furniture.
He lived his life in conversation.

When he passed, in his bed here at the Hotel Esplanade,
in 1904, he left one of the most far-reaching and innovative
legacies on earth, by giving every cent away.

Over the past century, the proceeds of Alfred Felton's estate
have supported millions of people in need, especially women
and children, and built the National Gallery of Victoria into
one of the world's greatest art galleries.

Today, the art purchased by the Alfred Felton Bequest for
the NGV is valued at over two billion dollars. It is three
quarters of the NGV's total art value.
